Who may earn?

All students (regular ed, special ed or students on a Section 504 plan) who have demonstrated the ability to meet the full set of academic content standards

Science - 2
Social Sciences - 2
Health - 1
Physical Education - 1
Career Technology, The Arts or Second Language - 1
Electives - 12

Demonstrate proficiency in Essential Skills with or without modifications

Complete “Personalized Learning Requirements”

Who May Earn?

All students who meet Modified Diploma requirements, have demonstrated the *inability* to meet the full set of academic content standards & who have a documented history of being unable to do so or a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievement

Requires parent/guardian consent

Extended Diploma

Requirements:

12 Credits in:

English/Language Arts - 2
Mathematics - 2
Science - 2
History, geography, economics or civics - 3
Health - 1
Physical Education - 1
The Arts or Second Language -1
(No more than 6 of these credits may be earned in a self-contained special education classroom)

Not required to demonstrate proficiency in Essential Skills or complete “Personalized Learning Requirements”

Who May Earn?

Special education students who 1) demonstrate the *inability* to meet the full set of academic content standards with reasonable modifications and accommodations, 2) have a documented history of being unable to do so or a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievement, and 3) participate in alternative assessment beginning no later than grade 6

Requires parent/guardian consent
