1943 State Championship Basketball Team Class B

The 1943 Basketball Team, coached by Romey Adams, defeated Westport 30-10 to win their League and advance to the District Tournament. There, they beat Westport 33-13, Clatskanie 39-19, and Nehalem 39-21 to earn a berth in the District Championship Game against Dayton. A win over Dayton, 29-21, earned them the opportunity to participate in the Class B State Tournament held at Willamette University. They defeated Powers 27-26 in the first round of the four-team tournament to reach the Championship Game. A 20-19 victory over Harrisburg gave the Warriors their first Basketball State Championship.

Junior Fred Wilson was named to the 1st Team All-State Tournament Team and senior Bill Bosshart was named to the 2nd Team. The team ended the season with a record of 15-3.

1972 State Championship Volleyball Team Class 1A-2A-3A

The 1972 Volleyball Team, coached by Jessie Wallace won 28 matches and lost only 4, as they made their way through the first combined State Volleyball Tournament sponsored by the Oregon Coaches Association. The team was made up of eight seniors. They won their region, defeating Colton in five games; (13-15, 15-11, 15-12, 9-15, and 15-7). At the State Tournament, they beat teams from much larger schools earning them the title of "Giant Killers" on their way to the Championship in the tournament that was held at Portland State University. In the first round they beat Chiloquin 15-1, 12-15, and 15-12 to advance to the second round. After winning 16-14, 15-3 over Woodburn, they were then victorious over Pleasant Hill 15-4, 10-15, 15-5, to reach the Championship Game. In the title game, they squeaked by Sheridan 16-14 in the first game before dominating them in the second game 15-7 to become State Champions.



1994 State Championship Baseball Team Class 2A

The 1994 Baseball Team, coached by Lennie Wolfe capped a 28-2 season by winning a state title by defeating Jefferson High School at Civic Stadium in Portland in the Championship game 4-3. They reached the championship game by defeating Dayton 8-2, then ten-running Grant Union 14-4 in five innings, and finally by beating Yoncalla 4-3 in the semi-finals. The Warriors brought home Warrenton's first State Basketball Championship in Coach Wolfe's third year at the helm.

Senior Todd Kobrzycki was named the Class 2A State Player of the Year and he, along with Charlie Parker and Mark McFadden were named first team All-Northwest League.





Dick & Harriett Baldwin – Faculty/Community Supporters

Dick and Harriett Baldwin were long-time and well respected educators in the Warrenton Public Schools. Dick was the Principal at Warrenton Grade School from 1935-45 after which he became the City Manager, a position he held for the next 30 years, retiring in 1975. Harriett started her teaching career in 1937 and continued serving the community for many years. After their passing, they found a way to continue touching the lives of the kids of Warrenton. The Dick & Harriett Baldwin Scholarship was established through the Gateway Masonic Lodge Scholarship fund and it has provided many, many scholarships, up to \$144,000 in value over four years to help WHS graduates further their education with their assistance.



Cynthia (Shepherd) Harber – Athlete/Alumni

Cynthia (Shepherd) Harber graduated from Warrenton High School in 1974 and is the most decorated individual athlete in Warrenton High School history. She was a six-time state champion in Track and Field, running on the state championship 4 x 100 meter relay team (50.5) as a sophomore and winning the Long Jump (17' 1/2") her junior year. As a senior, Cynthia placed herself among the states all-time elite athletes winning four individual gold medals at the state track meet. She won the gold in the long jump (18' 4 1/2"), the 100 M High Hurdles (14.9), the 100 M Dash (12.4), and the 300 M LH (45.4). It is believed that she is one of only two athletes ever to win four individual gold medals at the state meet in any classification.

Cynthia was also inducted as a Distinguished Alumni. She is an outstanding citizen, role model, and ambassador for Warrenton High School. She has excelled in the field of education and currently teaches at Astoria High School.

Dennis Bjork – Community Supporter/Alumni

1972 Warrenton High School graduate Dennis Bjork was inducted as a Community Supporter and a Distinguished Alumni for his many contributions to his alma mater. The best way to describe Dennis is “he has always been there and been there and been there.” As a well-known and successful businessman in Clatsop County as the owner-operator of Bergerson Construction, he has made Warrenton as little better place to go to school with his help. Jessie Wallace – Coach/Faculty

Jessie Wallace coached and taught at Warrenton High School from 1961 through 1985. She is thought of by many as a pioneer of girl's athletics at our school and in the state. She fought to secure equipment and gym time for her teams and always found a way to get what she needed. Her volleyball teams won four League titles and qualified for the State Tournament four times, winning the 1A/2A/3A State Championship with a 28-4 at the first OSAA-sponsored State Volleyball Tournament in 1972. In 1979 she was named the Oregon/Washington/Montana/Idaho/Alaska/Wyoming District Coach of the Year.
