


Hall of Fame - Class of 2014

Brian graduated from Warrenton High School in 2000 after being named first team All-League in baseball both his junior and senior years. He was named the Oregon 2A Player-of-the-Year in 2000. Brian was drafted right out of high school by the Arizona Diamondbacks and began his career there. He pitched for the 2009 World Champion New York Yankees as a member of that organization and also played for the Washington Nationals and the Chicago White Sox before retiring in 2012. Shaena Stabler

Shaena Stabler graduated from Warrenton High School in 2002 as valedictorian and was an accomplished athlete, lettering four years in basketball and softball. She was named all-league in both sports and was the Northwest League Player-of-the-Year in softball her senior year. She graduated from Colgate University with high honors in 2006 and is currently the co-owner of StuNewsLaguna, Laguna Beach, California's leading news source and on-line newspaper. Shaena has been recognized by her community, receiving the "My Hero" award and being named "Business Person-of-the-Year" in 2014. She is also an emerging songwriter/artist who released her first CD titled "Stay" on September 18, 2014.

2001 Football Team

The 2001 Northwest League Champion Warrenton Warrior football team enjoyed one of the most successful seasons in school history. A strong group of seniors provided the leadership to guide this team to eleven wins and a trip to the state semi-finals. Senior Mike Konidakis ran for 1,844 yards to lead an offense guided by senior quarterback Andy Horn that scored 427 points that season behind what may be the best offensive line ever to line up for the Warriors. The defense, led by seniors Isaac Anderson, Kyle Johnson, Josh Hollaway, Mike Konidakis and Adam Neahring and juniors Andy Forney and Beau Cederberg recorded 27 sacks and intercepted 28 passes, both school records.

Under the guidance of longtime head coach John Mattila, the 2001 version of the Warrenton Warriors dominated their opponents during the season and established themselves as one of the best 2A teams in the state. Their quest for a state title was ended when they were defeated by a tough Regis team in the semi-finals, putting an end to a memorable season.

Norm Doney

At 17, Norm Doney quit school to join the Navy and was an original crew member of the USS Valley Forge. He was discharged in 1947 and returned to Warrenton High School to graduate in 1950. In 1953 he enlisted in the Army where he received his Special Forces training in 1961 and served in a number of Special Forces units during the next 16 years, including the DET B-52 Delta Project. Norm was awarded the Silver Star for valor, achievement and service, and a Purple Heart among the 25 military decorations and awards bestowed upon him during his illustrious career. Upon his retirement, he returned to Warrenton and continued to work and dedicate himself to his country and those who served as he fought tirelessly for the POW/MIA causes. SGM Norman Doney served his country with distinction and honor his entire life. He passed away in 2013.

Trask Bergerson

Trask graduated from Warrenton High School in 1990. He was a four-time district champion and a four-time state finalist, winning championships his sophomore (106 lbs.) and senior (136 lbs.) years. He was runner-up his freshman (98 lbs.) and junior (149 lbs.) years. He posted a career record of 123-5 which included an undefeated senior year of 34-0. Trask also ranks high on the pin record board recording 61 pins in his 123 triumphs on the mat. He was a member of the wrestling team that won a dual meet state championship in 1990. Trask lives in Warrenton with his wife Vicki and they have two children Maevri and Rogue.

Ervin Lee Atkins, Sr.

Ervin Lee Atkins, Sr. taught woodshop/Mechanical Drawing at Warrenton High School from 1954 through 1964. In 1960, Mr. Atkins presented the idea of hosting an Honor Student Banquet to the members of the local Masonic Gateway Lodge No. 175 and the Warrenton High School Student Honor Banquet was born. 2014 marked the 54th anniversary of the banquet as scholarships were awarded to deserving Warrenton High School graduates to continue their educations. Ervin passed away in 2007.

Cynthia (Dunn) Grelck

A 1987 graduate of Warrenton High School, Cynthia participated in volleyball, basketball, and track and earned all-league honors in volleyball and basketball her senior year. She currently teaches math at Neah-Kah-Nie Middle School and was named the Small Schools Teacher-of-the-Year in 2013. Coach Grelck was also named the 2012 Northwest League Track Coach-of-the-Year.
